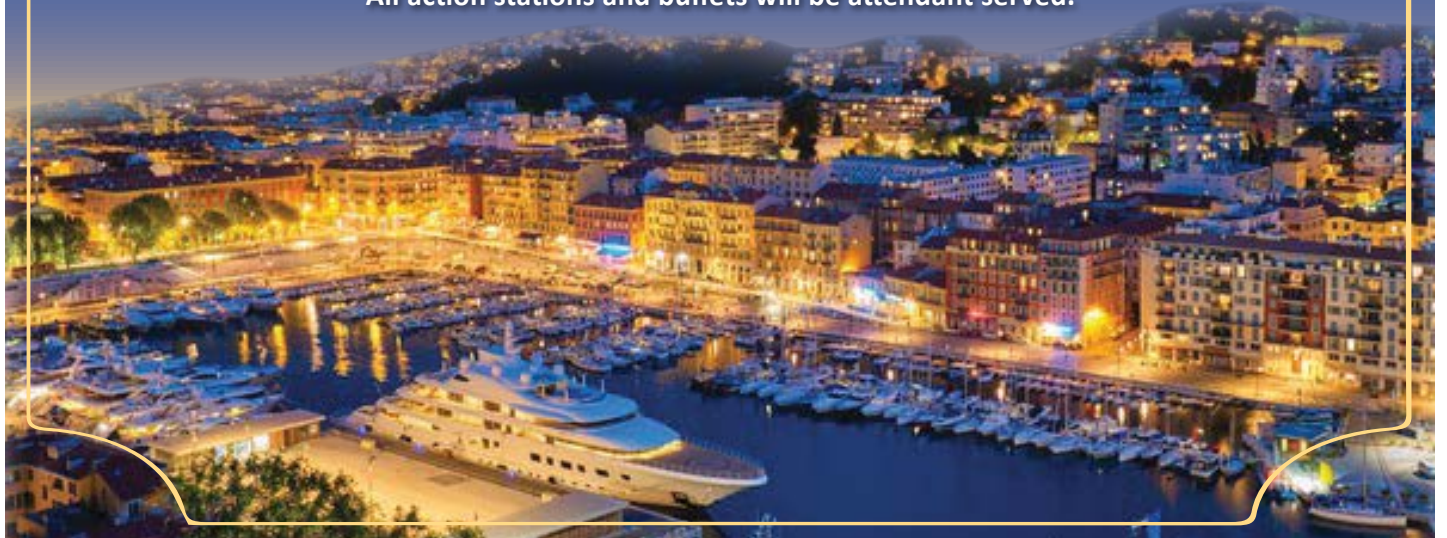

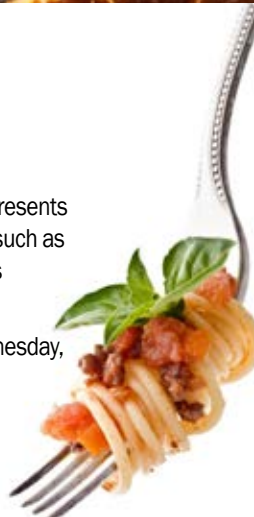

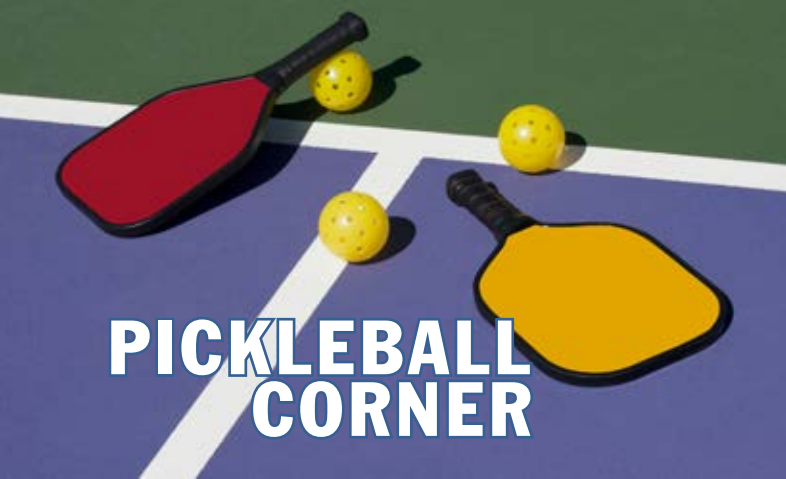

Course Care: It's Up to All of Us

Over the past three plus years, I have written vociferously about the importance of course care and stressed that it is everyone's responsibility to do their part to repair the damage that we inflict when we play golf. And I would say that overall, we have had mixed success with a lot of room for improvement and many, including my colleagues on the Golf Committee would argue that I probably am being kind in my assessment.

Unfortunately, we need to discuss it again, now.

The Covid-19 pandemic has brought new challenges and concerns to all of us—mostly forcing us to focus on protecting ourselves from getting the virus. Of course, the main weapon at our disposal has been masks and social distancing. To that end, for several months we have allowed players to be in individual carts. The good news is it speeds up play. The bad news is it puts twice the pressure and strain on the golf courses. According to Wes Dinsmoor, our Golf Superintendent, the growing season for our grass is March-October, so the grass recovers and course maintenance is more manageable. However, during the winter months, with cooler temperatures, grass growth slows dramatically. You probably notice that when the temperatures drop during the winter, the grass turns a different color and is not nearly as lush. In such conditions, course maintenance becomes very challenging if not impossible which means having worn areas that will not recover until spring.

The golf courses are a very valuable asset at Boca West and simply stated, we will not sacrifice or jeopardize them.

So here is the problem. If we continue to ignore course care now, we will pay for it this winter. When I say pay, I mean we face the distinct probability of having to go on Cart Path Only (CPO) for an extended period (most likely beginning of January until the end of March). So, for example, that could mean on odd days the odd numbered holes on all courses would be CPO and on even numbered days the even numbered holes would be CPO. (Please remember this would not include Par 3s because they are CPO all the time for everyone—no exceptions). Alternatively, we could designate entire courses as CPO on a regular, rotating basis. We could also close courses on a rotating basis similar to what we do in the summer. I think you would agree that none of the aforementioned steps would be desirable under any circumstances.

How can we prevent this? It is up to all of us to:

1. Employ the ninety-degree rule at all times. Stay on the cart path until you get to your ball, then drive over to it.
2. After you hit your shot get back on the cart path immediately. Do not drive down the fairway or rough to get to your ball.
3. Repair divots with sand—not a mountain, but level with the existing turf.
4. Scatter. Don't take the same route as the person driving in front of you. It only wears the grass down more.
5. Definitely avoid areas that start to show wear. There is no need to exacerbate the problem.
6. Most importantly, remind your fellow players to do the same.

Wes Dinsmoor is monitoring our courses assiduously, and he is keeping us informed regarding their condition. Just read his bulletins and you can see how we are doing. I hope everyone takes this matter very seriously. We all have a lot at stake.

I do have one bit of good news. **Pam Elders, our Director of Instruction was recently the recipient of the South Florida PGA Player Development Award.** The award recognizes innovation in teaching programs as well as programs designed to promote and encourage people to play golf. Pam has been very creative in this regard including her Boot Camps, arranging for games for all members and just being a great resource and teacher for all of us. Obviously, we are very proud of Pam and I hope everyone will congratulate her the next time you see her.

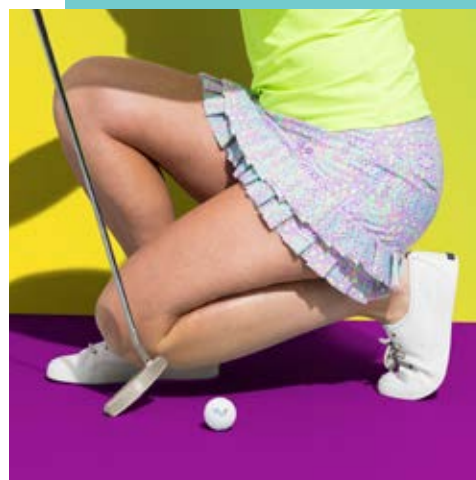
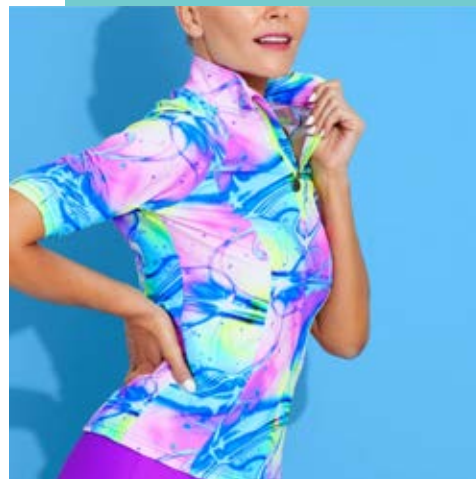

Emily Gifford, Director of Retail, recently sat down with Tzu Tzu Sport President and Creative Director, Lisa Mandile, to talk fashion and learn more about the incredibly talented golfer and woman behind the brand. ***Tzu Tzu has become synonymous with well-crafted high quality pieces, proudly made right here in the USA and will be carried in the Golf Shoppe this season.***

What is the story behind the name “Tzu Tzu Sport”? I'm asked quite often, “how did you come up with the name Tzu Tzu?” I had twin Shih “Tzu's” I adored. I wanted to name the company Samba after the twin that was with me for 17 years. Samba (as in the dance) meant Fun, Flirty and Sassy. Unfortunately, Adidas had the Trademark on Samba since the 70's on 1 pair of tennis shoes. So, I named our signature skirt after her instead. I didn't want anything too golf-y or kitschy sounding since I wanted to expand to tennis, yoga, or whatever. Tzu Tzu just kind of came out of my mouth one day. I figured no one may be able to pronounce it, but they'll remember it by how the name looked :). Fun fact, almost all of my styles are named after someone's pet. This way no one can be mad if I don't name a skirt or top after them.

Who is the “Tzu Tzu Sport” customer and are they the same customer you originally designed for when the line first launched? I was originally designing for both a young hip chick and more mature fit chick. I wasn't quite sure which category I “personally fell into at the time. But, there wasn't really anything for those of us who wanted to look cute and feminine on the golf course. It seemed like the style was to take a men's golf shirt and just cut it down to a women's size. I had a whole posse of golfing friends that we liked to look cute and chic and still be athletic, but we had to fit into the guidelines of the Country Club. I wanted to merge fashion and function. I wasn't quite sure how my silhouettes would go over in Florida. I wasn't sure if they'd be considered too “sexy.” As it turned out, the ladies gravitated towards my bright colors and sassy silhouettes. The price point wasn't always conducive to the younger market. Because Tzu Tzu is made in the USA, my cost of goods is much higher than the other brands manufactured overseas.

“TzuTzu Sport” is renowned for its bold designs and colors; where do you get your inspiration? I'm a bit of a peacock. I've always loved bright colors. My friends and I used to joke that “black is for amateurs”. Don't get me wrong, I like black too. But, I've always loved the Pucci type prints. Swashes of bright colors. Has the design philosophy changed over the years?

Do you feel that the integrity of the line has remained consistent? The design philosophy hasn't changed much. The design has always meant to flatter a woman's body. The silhouette is meant to be fitted and not tight. No matter what your body type is, it's just more flattering than a boxy fit. I try to make the prints fun and bright and not garish. I try to be thoughtful about my color palette. For example, I know many ladies feel they can't wear a yellow or a green by their face. I have chosen beautiful greens and yellows that actually look good next to almost anyone's face, no matter what your age. Trust me, I got my 86 year old mom in our lemon yellow top and she loves it and it looks great on her!

What is more important to you as a designer: fit or style and why?

Fit or Style? That's a hard one. I feel like they go hand in hand. If it fits right, it will enhance the style. When I see someone in a boxy golf top or skirt that is too big or long, I mentally alter it in my head. Boy, that outfit could be so much cuter if it were cut in here or shortened there. You can tell when a woman (or man for that fact) feels confident because of what they're wearing. I love to put ladies in a Tzu Tzu skirt or top or one of our dresses that they never thought they could wear (it's too short or too tight blah blah) and once they get it on and they see how good they look in a certain silhouette, they just beam. That is my favorite part. Fashion can change your day.

What has set TzuTzu Sport apart from all of the other apparel lines in the golf industry?

I like to think it's the little details. Our luxurious fabrics and thoughtfulness of proportion and design. I refuse to compromise on a cheap flimsy fabric. Upon first touch, it may feel thicker than most golf fabrics. But, when you wear it, it's really lovely and breathable. It hides a multitude of sins and in our hot Florida sunshine, the fabrics dry quickly if it's a Sweaty Betty day. Proportion is really important. My small girls don't want long skirts and my bigger girls don't want short skirts. So, I graduate the lengths on the skirts rather than having just 1 length. My goal was for the ruffles to be flirty and not frilly. As for our tops, I cut the arm holes in for a reason. It flatters every woman's arms and shoulders. It doesn't matter what size you are. If you're in great shape, it shows off the guns. And if your arms aren't the best part of your figure, it will make them look good. Trust me, anyone can wear my tops. Again, I've got my mom exclusively wearing Tzu Tzu (and I didn't think that would ever happen.) The hidden pocket in the back, the length of the shorts under skirts, the arm holes in the tops, the ruched sleeves in the jackets...I like to think those details set us apart. It's important that my silhouettes are flattering as well as functional. I like that our curvy girls feel just as great as our tiny girls. That's all I'm interested in, just making people feel and look good. Happy golfing!!

BALLOTING—WHAT DO WE KNOW

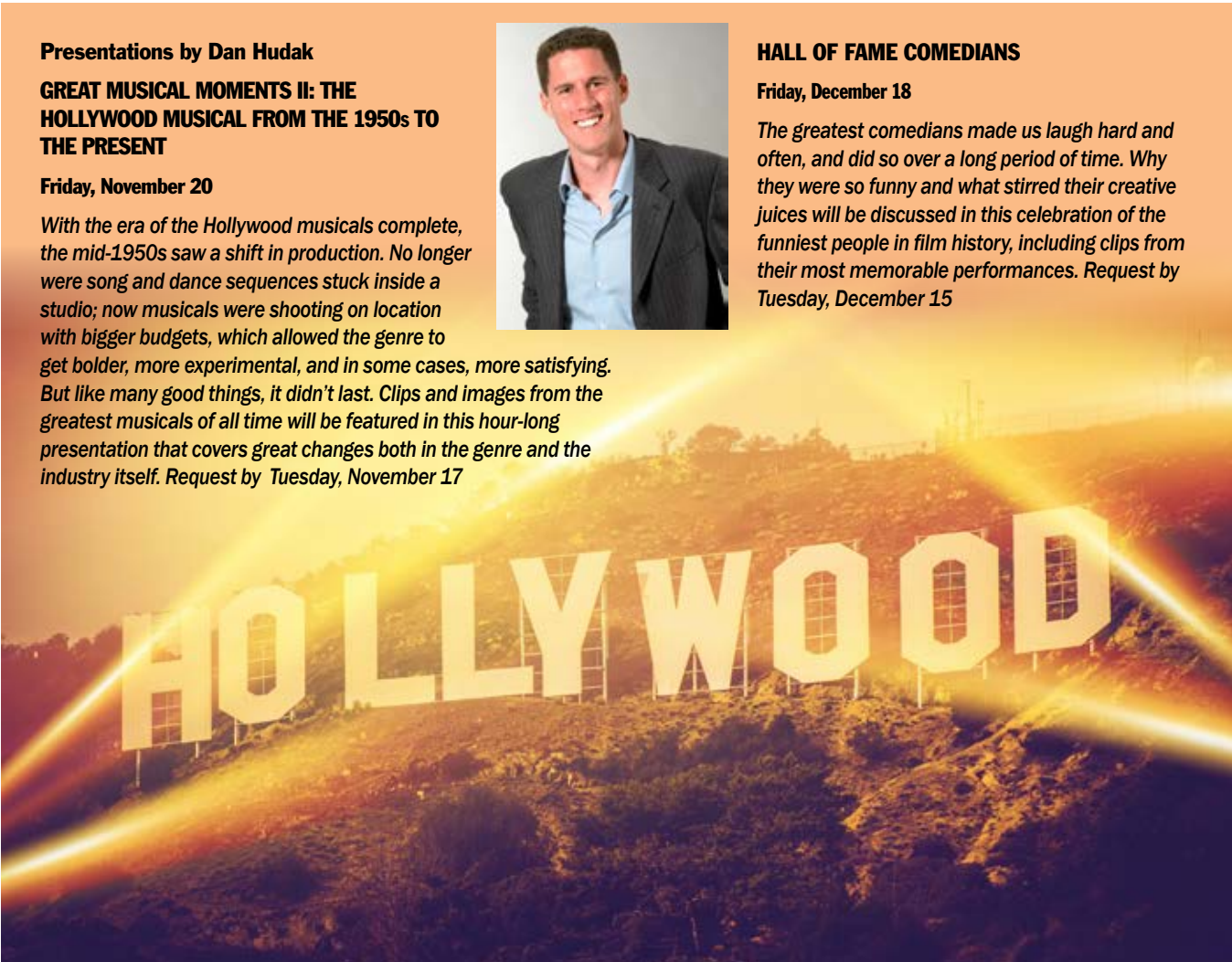

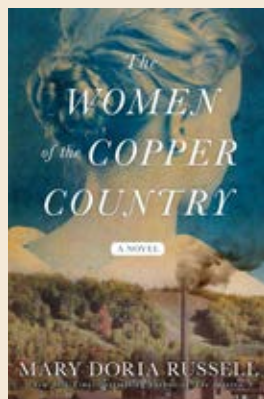

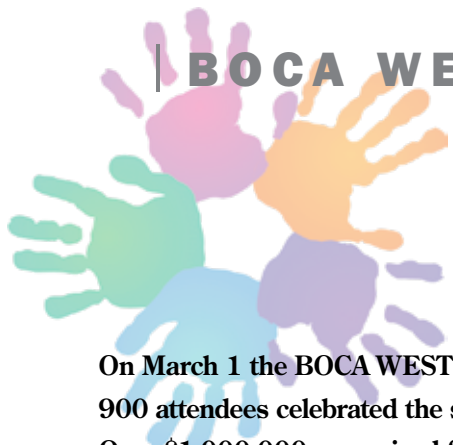

On March 1 the BOCA WEST CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION HELD ITS 10TH ANNIVERSARY GALA. Almost 900 attendees celebrated the success of the first 10 years of the Foundation's works and had a marvelous time. Over \$1,000,000 was raised for the 9,000 children helped daily by the 31 projects of our granted charities. No one knew then that would be the last major face to face fundraiser for the next seven months....for any charitable organization.

These times that are both scary and difficult for all of us are intensified for the children who were at risk prior to the onslaught of Covid-19. The lack of food, clothing, services and the ability to keep them from being abused has grown tremendously.

We have used our contributors monies well over these past few months:

- working with the **Boys and Girls Clubs of Palm Beach County** creating and executing their "Farms to Families" Program
- aiding **Boca Helping Hands** double their food distributions system.
- helping **Florence Fuller Child Development Center** and the YMCA care for over 800 pre-k kids in a safe and sound way so their parents could go to work.
- partnering with our foster home programs at **SOS Children's Villages, JAFCO, Home Safe, Grandma's Place, Best Foot Forward** and the **Place of Hope** to expand their reach in keeping their hundreds of kids in a safe environment.
- over 1,000 beds have been distributed and assembled to kids identified as sleeping on the floor or with multiple siblings in the same bed during the pandemic by **Sweet Dream Makers**.
- our scholarship programs continued with over 200 college aid programs awarded through our partnerships with **The Viner Scholars, FAU Foundation, Kelly-Strul First in Family, Bound for College** and the **Rotary Club of Boca Raton**.
- our very special kids were able to continue to be served through our partnerships with the **Unicorn Academy, JAFCO's Ability Center, Camp Kavod, the Faulk Foundation** and the **Center for Family Services**.
- healthcare during these times for children at the poverty level is critical and through our programs with the **Caridad Center** and the **Children's Healthcare Society** we have been in the forefront.
- school children without tablets or other options were not able to participate in virtual schooling. Working with the **Educational Foundation of Palm Beach County** and the **Spirit of Giving** hundreds of tablets and school supplies were able to be distributed.

There are an additional dozen other charities that we partner with that continued to reach out and help those kids in need and they need your support.

Each year at this time the Foundation turns to you, the Boca West members, to help us continue our work. We have no endowment. We carefully grant all monies that are contributed by you to vetted and very worthwhile and needing charities. **THIS YEAR MORE THAN EVER...WE NEED YOU!**

A MESSAGE FROM THE LEGAL COMMITTEE

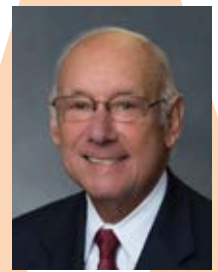

Boca West is a private member owner residential country club, formed for social and recreational purposes. Membership is exclusive to owners of residential lots in our gated community. Simply put, we are not only fellow owner/members, we are also neighbors. As owners of the Club, every Member has the right to question, complain or make suggestions on policies or operations of the Club. Over the years Management and the Board have received numerous emails, letters and telephone calls from Members not always supporting what is going on; some asking for a better understanding of what is going on or requesting that Management and the Board consider changes in policies and procedures. Those inquiries are all answered either by a return phone call or by a return email. As an owner Member you have every right to question, complain or make suggestions. This article deals with the impact of certain emails which once they go into cyberspace can affect the harmony and good reputation of our Club and may even be hurtful to a neighbor or fellow member.

Our governing documents contain several sections that protect our privacy, require that we behave in a civil manner, member to member and neighbor to neighbor and most importantly protect the good reputation of our club. Article X, Section 10.02 of our Bylaws is one such provision. It states: "Members, their family members, houseguests, guests and invitees shall comply with the Bylaws and Club Rules at all time. Any Member, any family member, houseguests, guests or person whose conduct is determined by the Board of Governors to be improper or likely to endanger the welfare, safety, harmony or good reputation of the Club or its Members, may be reprimanded, fined or suspended from the Club by action of the Board of Governors." Emails that are hateful, insulting, disparaging to fellow members, Management or the Staff that may be copied or directed to multiple recipients and go viral, can hurt our Club. We have had incidents when some of these emails went public where real estate agents at other competing residential communities have told potential buyers, "there's trouble at Boca West".

In a community of over 3,000 residential units and over 5,000 Members, we must abide by our Bylaws, Rules and Regulations treating everyone with respect fairly and compassionately. Our Grievance procedures ensure that the isolated few in their email correspondence about the Club do not disrupt the welfare, safety, harmony and or good reputation of the Club and its Members. Our governing documents do not impede the membership from expressing their views in a civil and respectful manner. The behavior of any individual member or group of members in using their emails for Club related matters, continues to be subject to Article X of our Bylaws. Members are therefore cautioned that, for example, statements made in emails or on social media which might go viral and are about the Club, the writer or forwarder risks having their words construed as likely to effect the harmony and good reputation of the Club and subject the writer or writers or forwarders to a Grievance Complaint. Uncivil and disrespectful remarks in emails likewise may subject members to a Grievance Complaint from other members. So before you tap that SEND button, especially in the heat of the moment, it pays to take a breath, reread what you have written or what you are about to forward and consider that the message may need editing or be better made in a phone call or in a letter sent by US mail.

- Member Village Representatives' meetings are held during in-season.

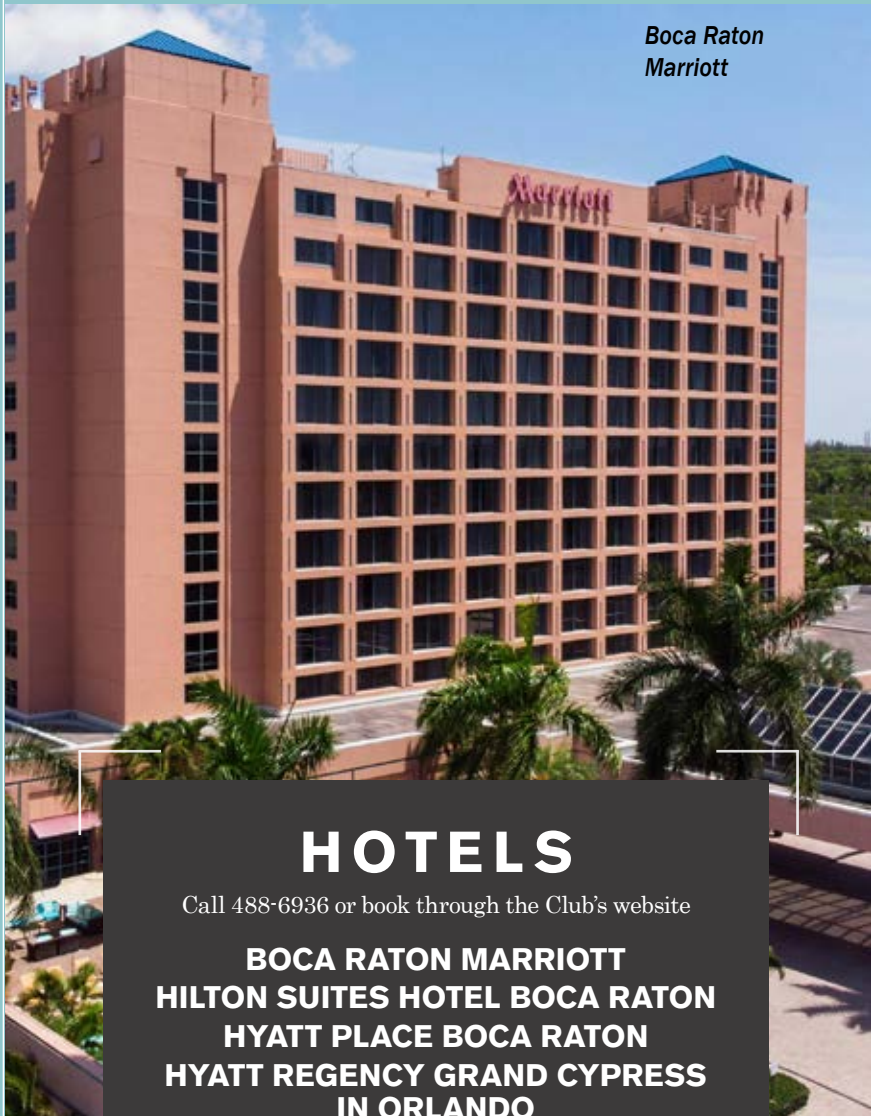

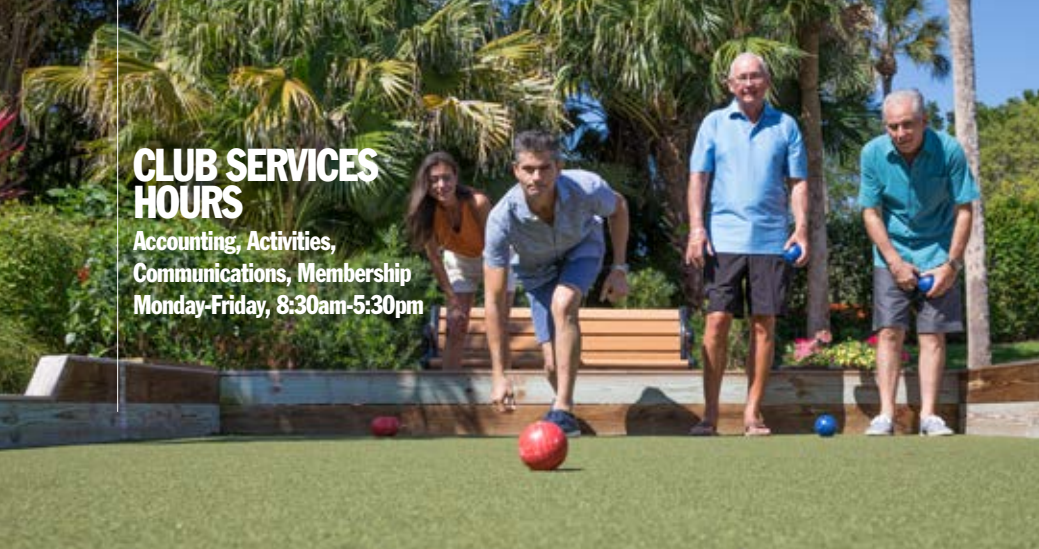

| CHAIRMAN'S LETTER



FIRST AND FOREMOST, I hope that you and your families have remained safe and well during these unprecedented times.

Before I discuss with you some of the positive news and activities that have occurred and warrant mentioning, I need to inform you that unfortunately more grievances than normal are being heard by our Grievance Committee under the chairmanship of Rick Chavis and then our Board of Governors. In view of several recent grievances stemming from group emails, I have asked our Legal Chairman, Jerry Glassman, to write an article on the subject. Please read it on page 29.

I want to now begin our good news by congratulating my predecessor, Howard Liebman who was recognized as one of 24 nominees chosen by The Boardroom, a magazine for Private Club Presidents and Board Chairs of the Year 2019. This honor bestowed upon Howard simply proves what we already knew. Boca West Country Club is privileged to have had him as our Chairman and his continuing involvement in our Leadership

Program and Special Projects has been invaluable.

Speaking about recognition, we did it again! Although 2020 has been quite a challenging year for all, I am proud to announce that Boca West has maintained its Platinum Club of America status for 2021-22 as well as the Distinguished Club status for 2020. Additionally, in recognition of extraordinary effort put forth by golf pros and golf directors, Brad "JR" Friend received special recognition from Distinguished Club for his efforts and leadership within the Private Club Industry.

Both awards recognize Private Clubs and their management for outstanding delivery of exceptional Member Experience. On behalf of the Board of Governors and Members, I would like to thank Matthew and his entire team.

Now let's look at our financial status. I am proud to report to you that despite having had to deal with so many operational unknowns, we closed out our fiscal year that ended on September 30 with a slight profit, ahead of our breakeven budget. As I have previously said, doing so was no small feat. Our Management, led by our President, COO and General Manager Matthew Linderman and our Director of Finance Kathy Campbell, was able to quickly identify cost savings opportunities as soon as our revenue stream quickly dried up. They put the brakes on all purchasing and expenses that were controllable; and, they went to our key vendors and renegotiated contractual agreements for services such as our valet service and night cleaning crews while the buildings were closed. They were also able to get our 300 plus international employees home safely and sooner than originally anticipated to significantly reduce our payroll costs while at the same time, they kept our local employees paid and insured. We should all feel so good and thankful that Management was able to protect our most important asset, our employees. No wonder our employees voted Boca West Country Club as a Sun Sentinel Top Workplace for 2020. Boca West was the only country club within the large employer category.

I would like to update you on a recent phenomenon that speaks wonders about the success of the marketing efforts of Boca West Realty. As previously mentioned, Boca West Realty is our marketing vehicle. Like developers of a new residential country club, Boca West Realty is marketing our lifestyle locally, nationally and internationally. As a result, we are seeing an increase in potential members. In the past, most of our new Members resided outside of Florida. However, today we see that of the 91 new Members who bought in Boca West from May through September, twenty nine percent or 26 new Members lived in local surrounding communities here in Florida, with many of them never knowing what a paradise existed behind our walls. Today they are making Boca West their permanent home in Florida.

In closing I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the retirement of Darlene Wright. On behalf of me, our current Board of Governors and all Board Members who preceded us, we wish Darlene a long and healthy retirement as she relocates with her husband Billy to Alabama. Darlene has been our Executive Assistant to the President, Chief Operating Officer and General Manager for nearly 34 years. She is known by all as our historian and the constant glue that has kept us all together operating as one. Darlene, we will miss you and also want to thank you for working with your replacement, Lironne Stefaniw, during this past year in order to insure we have a seamless transition.
