BY NOW I HOPE MOST OF YOU HAVE SEEN THE NEW LIFESTYLE CENTER, WHETHER IN PERSON OR VIA VIDEO THAT WAS SENT OUT TO THE MEMBERSHIP. Members were thrilled and enjoyed the tours of the facility given by the staff when it first opened back in July. We have received overwhelmingly positive reviews for both **Blue Point** and **Aria Bar + Rooftop**. Both venues were opened in August and those that have experienced these venues are raving! For those of you up north, we are really excited for you to return and see it for yourselves. Our team has planned many new programs for all with many new activities and events, with some of your Boca West favorites.

It's been a busy summer at Boca West with our annual repairs and maintenance to our facilities: The Golf and Activities Center pavers and travertine were replaced at the Porte Cochere entrance and the worn carpet down the hallways outside the Multipurpose rooms were replaced with tile. The exterior

of the Country Club and Golf and Activities Center buildings were also repainted to match the new Lifestyle and Racquet Centers; although the roof work was challenging with all the rain we had. The Salon had some refurbishments done and I know many of you agree it was much needed. Also, currently under construction is **The Studio**, our Art and Epicurean venue space. The progress is moving along nicely with an expected opening in early 2025.

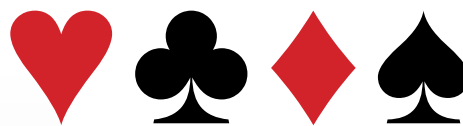

I hope everyone has enjoyed a wonderful summer. All of us in Agronomy/Golf Operations welcome those members who have been away, back to Boca West.

Travis Wehrs, Director of Golf and his team have finalized all the details for an exciting 2024-2025 golf season. Please take time to review the newly designed golf/instructional book which has the details of our tournament schedule and instructional programs being offered. When you open the Boca West App, click on Golf, scroll down to Tournament Forms, and if the event is open, you will have the option to register. This process has been simplified and is easy to master, even for me.

Registration for our October golf events will be closed by the time this article is released, however if you would like to participate in the Par 3 18 Hole or Luken-Mixer events reach out to Golf Operations and we will see if there is room to be added. Our season opening golf tournament will be played on November 9-10 followed by our opening golf dinner on Sunday, November 10.

Golf Updates for the period October 1, 2023 - July 31, 2024

This past season, we hosted 120,345 golf rounds. During this period, our members recorded 41 hole-in-ones and 44 eagles.

As previously mentioned, our expected opening of Fazio II will be early November and driving will be permitted on the fairways.

He played golf professionally from 2019-2022. In addition, he was the Master Club Fitter at Golf Galaxy and Club Champion. I am thrilled to welcome him and know he will be a valued member of the team.

The Special Projects Committee is aptly named as we are one of the reasons Boca West continues to be, well, Boca West. Our efforts start long before simple ideas mature into concrete plans worthy of being presented to Members for consideration. They include discussions of trends, member suggestions, Club market indicators, long range planning and proactive vision of Residential Country Club lifestyles wants and needs.

Over the next few months, we will describe in a series of articles who we are and how we help plan, design, finance and then build Club improvements to elevate our member experience and attract new members. We will also outline our short and long-term projects. In doing so, our goal is to equip our membership with a greater understanding of how the Committee positively impacts the value of one principle asset owned by each Member — our homes.

Broadly, the Committee helps our leaders define the Club's future needs, determine what is achievable, and analyze how we can reach the goals that have been set. In the "planning" stages we use feedback and analytics of how our Club is used historically and today; suggestions from members, staff, buyers and from prospects who have been "shopping" Boca West. We look at who the next generation of buyers will be and what attracts them to country club living. We explore what our Country Club and housing "competitors" are doing today, what the trends are and what they have planned for the future. Our goal is to determine how Boca West will remain competitive and most importantly, lead our industry. Can we continue as a leader by simply "tweaking" existing facilities, or must we create totally new ones by anticipating the trend? Our horizon for planning is the next five to 10+ years. This summarizes our first significant role of planning. We will discuss our execution role in a later column.

Let's start with who is on the Special Projects Committee. We are Co-Chaired by **Jeanine Banks**, Chairman & CEO and **Matthew Linderman**, President, COO and General Manager. The Committee Members approved by the Board are **Robert Schwartz**, Second Vice President, **Danny Schulman**, Vice Chair of Golf and **Phil Kupperman**, Past Chairman of the Board and Member at Large. The Board and Management's focus is on the need to modernize and expand our mostly 20 plus year old Golf and Racquet Sports facilities. We therefore enlisted the participation of **Robert Lerner** and **Steve Roth**, Chairs of the Golf and Racquet Sports Committees respectively and **Arthur Adler**, Chair of House and Activities Committee. As projects evolve, we address the fiscal and legal contracting components to include others experienced in Cash Flow Modeling, Bank facilities, Legal and the Club's overall financial position. **Kathy Campbell**, CFO, **Arthur Schwartzman**, First VP & Finance Chair, **Enid Hoffman**, Treasurer & Budget Chair, **Joan Atterman**, Audit Chair & Vice Chair of Finance and **Jonathan Schraub**, Legal Chair will also provide input to the Committee. It is important to note that vetted external accounting, financial, legal, engineering, architectural, design, construction and project management entities will also be engaged throughout the scope.

What follows is a summary of short-term projects that are currently being considered for a formal presentation to the Membership in January. We have organized the multi-phase components in chronological sequence to better illustrate the flow of what will be proposed.

Calendar Years 2025 and 2026 - Racquet Sports Center

We intend to propose a complete rebuild of all of our Tennis and Pickleball Courts to bring us to 24 Tennis and 25 Pickleball Courts. The Tennis Courts, although have all been resurfaced numerous times over the many years, its infrastructure and drainage are close to 40 years old and have continued to cause many costly issues. With the growth we have experienced in Pickleball and what we expect the future demand to be, we are preparing to meet our projected facility and programming needs. If approved, this work would begin this coming Summer and phased in over two years so Member play can be accommodated throughout with as little Member disruption as possible.

The renovation plan includes the cosmetic upgrade to the existing Racquet Shoppe, as well as a buildout, of a new Pickleball complex and building which will showcase our new Pickleball Center Court for events and exhibitions. This building will include a new shop, wraparound terrace seating, event bar, restrooms with showers as well as several day lockers for visiting Tennis and Pickleball teams. This expansion will include an Event Lawn to accommodate exhibitions and events associated with the Racquet Sports membership community. Currently the expansion program includes a structured roof that will cover a portion of the Pickleball Courts.

Employee Building and Kitchen Areas

Everyone recognizes the importance of our number one asset – our staff. To maintain our presence of being a highly regarded Top Workplace and an Employer of Choice attracting and retaining the best talent, our behind the scenes work and rest areas are simply not adequate. With approximately 550 year-round and 400+ seasonal staff members, our current Locker Rooms and Break Rooms cannot accommodate the current growth and expected increases to meet demand. Our plans include a new enlarged Employee Break Room, Training Room, Restrooms, Locker Rooms and Offices. The plan includes moving our Human Resources (HR) Office onto our campus to be closer to Staff and converting our current HR space outside of the Glades Gate into a Staff Recruitment Office. Additionally, with the increased usage and supply volume of our restaurants, we propose to grow our Purchasing and Receiving Areas along with expanding the Main Country Club Kitchen and Loading Dock Area to support our future needs.

Calendar Years 2026/2027 - Golf Amenities and Facilities

Over the last few years our Board and Management have communicated to Members our need to update all four Golf Courses and related facilities and our desire to do so systematically over the remainder of this decade. Due to the age of the golf course irrigation systems (over 40 years old) coupled with the unavailability of crucial replacement parts, antiquated bunkers, as well as the age of the grass itself, our infrastructure is at a stage that forces us to implement complete rebuilds. The current plan is to commence with a total renovation and redesign of Palmer I and Palmer III. The renovation of Palmer III will also include an expansion of our Driving Range, a new Active Short Game and Putting Facility and updated Comfort Stations. We are planning for this work to commence at the end of the 2026 peak season and anticipate an opening in December 2026, barring any unforeseen weather circumstances. This plan also includes the creation of a Golf Performance Center which will be located adjacent to the northside of the Driving Range with an expected completion later in 2027.

The renovation of Palmer I is anticipated to begin, if approved, at the end of 2027 peak season. This total rebuild will include an 18 Hole redesigned course and updated Comfort Stations. In addition, given the surplus acreage already existing, and to accommodate some of the current 25% of 9 hole rounds played, a new 9 Hole Par 3 Course and an 18 Hole Putting Course will be added located behind the new Aquatics Center. Fry/Straka Global Golf Design, our Golf Course Architects, developed this plan to add these forward-thinking new amenities. The planned opening for all of this is anticipated for opening December 2027.

Fazio II and Dye IV are planned for the end of the decade and we will return to the membership in the next few years, when timing is appropriate.

Living Room Terrace, Lakeside Event Lawn, Safer Cart and Walking Paths, and Storage

With the re-work of Palmer III anticipated to begin at the end of the 2026 Season, we are proposing to add a very much needed Outdoor Terrace to the back of the Living Room Lounge. This will serve to accommodate the increased demand for the Lounge and will include outside seating and an event bar. It will also showcase the exterior beauty overlooking the Golf Course and the new water features that are planned. This new space will also allow additional reception space for Member Events and busier Panache Restaurant evenings.

Below this Terrace Extension we are planning a new and vital storage facility. Storage is crucial for all of the many outdoor events we hold each year. With the newly found love of our members craving outside venues post Covid, we are continuing to find opportunities to hold events to take in the magnificent Boca West landscape. This new storage area will allow for the Member Cart Parking Area to return underneath Prime Cut. Also included in this plan is the addition of an Event Lawn for Member Events in front of a newly designed lake and newly laid out Cart Paths. This will more efficiently accommodate the traffic along with additional cart parking behind our Clubhouses and provide for a much safer walking and driving of Golf Carts.

In November's Article we will discuss our analysis for re-purposing the Golf and Activities Center to better utilize its space. This will address how our facilities are currently being used and how member needs and wants have evolved since it was constructed in 2017 and our desire to make these changes in 2027. Next month we will also outline the Committee's most important role of helping Management, the Board, our in-house and outside professionals, consultants and contractors develop blueprints into actual buildings and amenities.

We hope we have whetted your appetites. Many pieces need to fall into place before these next elements in our Club Improvement Program become a reality. We will present more details to you in the coming months.

As always, the Club's business model is to fund and secure these undertakings from New Member Joining Fees rather than from operating income or dues.

Each morning, we see 35-50 members actively participating in Pickleball, along with quite a few tennis reservations for those enjoying their summer here or visiting our facilities. Some of you have returned to Boca West and we want to welcome you back. Others of you are still enjoying your time away from us and we are looking forward to seeing you back soon. We are pleased to report that the repairs on tennis courts 30-33, previously affected by the ficus trees, have been completed. Additionally, we have made a notable improvement to the area by installing a new water and ice machine adjacent to the six new Pickleball/Tennis courts. This much-needed addition enhances the convenience and comfort for our Pickleball and Tennis players.

Looking ahead, our Women's POWER Pickleball fall session is set to begin this month, featuring four teams in the league compared to three last fall session. We are excited to witness the continued growth of our Pickleball community. This fall, we are excited to introduce a new Pickleball league: the Premier Pickleball League. This Co-Ed league is designed for players aged 55 and over, featuring five lines of play. Each line can consist of mixed doubles, men's doubles, or women's doubles, allowing for a variety of match combinations against any of those pairings. We are eager to embark on our first season in this league, especially after participating in the Play It Forward league last year, which only offered a 65+ fall session with a different format. What makes the Premier Pickleball League even more special is its commitment to giving back; the entry fees from this league will support local charities, including the Boca West Children's Foundation, Hadassah, and The Pap Corps. We are also looking forward to the second season of the Kitchen Dinks League which will be starting in January, but you will be getting information in the coming months.

In October, we will host our final USTA junior tournament this fall with the Columbus Day Open, from October 12-14. Matches will be held on the stadium court after 11am daily, providing an excellent opportunity for members to come and watch some exciting junior tennis.

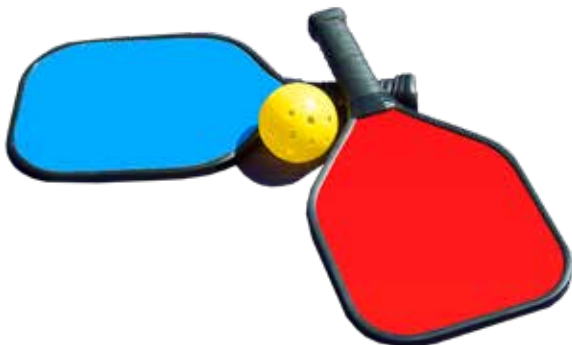

Equity Racquet Sports Members

Members under this category may invite up to three guests at any day of the week. Guests of equity racquet sports members will receive complimentary court fees on Mondays, Fridays and Sundays.

Equity Social and Lessee Members

Members in these categories will receive complimentary court fees on Monday and Friday. They may invite up to three guests any day of the week and guests will receive complimentary court fees on Mondays, Fridays and Sundays.

Guest Fees: \$14 per person, per day before 1pm and \$10 per person, per day after 1pm for Gold Card guests and Day guests. A non-member may be a guest of the Club no more than six times per membership year (October 1- September 30). Equity members, lessees and non-member residents of Boca West are not eligible to be day guests or house guests. Please Note: A day guest is the guest of a member for the day and must be accompanied by the member AT ALL TIMES when using any of the Club facilities. However, after checking a guest in for personal services such as lessons and massages, the member is free to leave the guest and the facility during the performance of the service. It is not necessary to obtain a house guest card for a day guest. All daily guest fees for use of the facilities will apply.

If you no longer want to receive a printed copy of the magazine, please choose None. Scroll down to update your interests in the "My Interests" section and don't forget to update your choices in the "Targeted Marketing Opt-in Email Groups" section below. This will help ensure you're informed about the activities in which you are most interested.

Member Directory – Check the "My Buddies" section in the Member Directory to be sure your list is current. If you're missing anyone, find them in the "Members" section, scroll down to the bottom of their profile and "add" them to "My Buddy List". Another great feature is the ability to "Add to Phone" at the bottom of the page which will add your friend as a contact on your phone. You can also call the person with one tap on the phone icon next to their phone number in the directory. While in the "My Buddies" section if you tap on your buddy's name you can bring up their profile page from the "Members" section.

This Week, Today at a Glance and Calendar of Events continue to be areas on the APP that are accessed most frequently by our members. Tapping on the box below that says "Today at a Glance" is the quickest way to find out what's open, what's closed and the current hours for Golf, Raquet Sports, Dining options, Card Rooms, Fitness and Retail.

Reservations for Golf, Tennis, Dining and other Activities can easily, quickly and efficiently be made using the APP. For Golf, Tennis or Dining, tap on the appropriate box on the home page and the first thing listed will be "Request" a Tee Time, "Request" Court or Dining "Request". Just tap and follow the prompts to make your request. If you'd like to reserve a table in one of our Cardrooms, Tap on the "Calendar of Events" box on the home page and scroll over to the Card Room section and then scroll down to find the time and location you'd like to reserve and tap on "Request". In the same area in the "Calendar of Events" section, if you tap on "Activities", you'll find a list of all upcoming activities for which you can also tap "Request" to register.

Statements can be found by tapping on the "Statements" box on the home page of the APP. You can actually see most of the charges on your account that have been posted for the current month through the prior day.

Dear Boca West Residents,

Each month I will be highlighting one of the Masters Association committees. This month we feature one of our busiest committees: Architectural Control.

The purpose of the Architectural Control Committee is to provide for the protection of building integrity, standards, aesthetics and overall harmony of Boca West and Village communities and environment. The ACC does not seek to restrict individual creativity, but rather to maintain the aesthetic relationship among homes, within Villages, golf courses and natural surroundings.

MESSAGE FROM STEVE JONAS, CHAIR OF ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

I am happy to report that the ACC is quite busy. We review an average of 40 petitions every month. The committee is made up of dedicated volunteers who have expertise and experience in building, renovations and general aesthetics. Each petition is reviewed and the work site is examined in person. The committee works very hard with management companies, village and Condo HOAs and homeowners to assure them that exterior improvements are completed following proper guidelines. Our objective is to encourage improvements to homes and apartments. The ACC works to be the source of proper information to the homeowners.

Briefly, the guidelines are only for changes to property exterior appearances including, but not limited to, tear-down and rebuild of homes, additions, new or extended patios, new screen enclosures or alterations to existing screen enclosure colors, design, or frames, window and door alterations, paving Village signage, new pool/spa installations, golf cart enclosures, and some Village landscaping projects.

The ACC recommends that you contact the Master Association if you are not sure whether a petition (ARB) is needed for work on the exterior of your home. A word of advice: Do not rely on contractors or vendors. Always check with your management company or the Master Association.

Recently there were both state and local updates to ACC guidelines.

1. Roofs of villages, condos and private homes need to be maintained in clean fashion. The ACC randomly inspects roofs. If identified as needing cleaning the appropriate parties will be notified, given time to clean the roof. Penalties will be assessed if ignored.
2. Hurricane shutters are permitted to be deployed starting June 1 and must be retracted by November 30.
3. There are specific guidelines for construction of golf cart sheds in villages. These guidelines are available at the Master office.



All guideline changes were adopted to assure the beauty, aesthetics and consistency of Boca West.

This committee is happy to be part of continued updating and improvements throughout Boca West.

FINANCE REPORT

Nine Months Ended June 30, 2024

It seems every year goes by faster than the year before and unbelievably we are already into the fall of 2024. I hope everyone has had a wonderful and safe summer. I also want to extend a warm welcome back to our seasonal members who are now starting to return to Boca West.

As I reported in my last article, revenues for Golf Operations, Racquet Sports, Spa and Fitness and Food and Beverage all remain above both budget and prior year numbers. Increased catering events have also contributed significantly to our bottom line. As a result, management has commenced several projects including the painting of our Golf & Activities Center, Country Club and Mr. D's buildings, paving repairs at the front entrance to the Golf & Activities Center and Fazio II regrassing.

Before reporting on our financial results, let me give a brief shout out to our CFO, Kathy Campbell and Controller, Kris Nielson for their professionalism and commitment to provide our Board of Governors and Management the timely information and insight required to make informed decisions to keep our Club in a strong financial position.

Operating Results:

Our Club continues to remain in excellent financial condition. Results of operations for the nine-month period ended June 30, 2024 are significantly ahead of budget, as a result of the aforementioned revenue increases and a large positive variance of \$820K in wages, taxes and fringe benefits. The anticipated earlier opening of Market Square, the Aquatics Complex and Lifestyle Center have contributed substantially to these savings as well as a gradual phase-in of certain positions throughout the Club.

Other items reflecting large positive variances to budget through June 30 are other income sources, including guest fees and interest income of \$346K and operating expenses anticipated, but not incurred, at the Blue Point restaurant of \$250K.

As a result of increased member activity throughout the Club, negative variances through June 30 are reflected in most areas of Club departmental operating expenses, supplies, repairs and maintenance; most notably Food & Beverage \$260K and Engineering \$410K.

Cash Balances and Bank Debt:

As of June 30, cash on hand this year was \$3.6M compared to \$8.6M last year. The outstanding balance on our bank line of credit this year was \$22.5M compared to \$41.0M last year. Expressed another way, our bank debt in excess of cash was \$18.9M, this year vs \$32.4M, last year or an improvement of \$13.5M, year over year.

Joining Fee, Capital Projects and Financing

Our Club's net joining fees continue to outperform the original projections as submitted to our bank, Fifth Third Bank, to support our line of credit for the construction of our recently completed Lifestyle Center and other major projects. Net joining fees from new members were \$10.2M this year through June 30 compared to \$7.4M last year. Current projections anticipate that collection of joining fees will exceed the cost of these projects almost four years earlier than originally projected.

As you know, joining fees are the primary funding source to support our major projects and to secure our line of credit. This line of credit expires in February 2026; however, the Club may extend the maturity date one time for up to five years under terms and conditions substantially similar to the original terms which will give the Club the flexibility and opportunity for additional projects in the near future.

Other Matters:

Home sales continue to remain strong. This year, through June 30, new member sales closed and pending, are 167 compared to 178 last year. In addition, during this period we have had a net increase of 8 equity memberships, resulting from the conversion of non-equity and non-performing units.

During the first nine months of this fiscal year, 13 members have not paid their dues compared to 16 last year and a budget of 25.

On top of your favorite events (Spin the Wheel Sales, Super Demo Days, and Holiday Bazaar), new retail programming and special promotions have been added including Coastal Cabana Trunk Shows, Let your Logo Shine discount days, Black Friday Sale, "Pink Out" Sale, Men's Night, Ladies' Night, Racquets Color War Sale, Spring Shopping Open House, and Margarita Madness.

In the market for a new set of golf clubs? Stop by **The Golf Studio** to meet Jacob Huizinga, our new Club Fitting Specialist. GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Grievance Committee conducts its investigation and submits a report to the Board of Governors. The report includes recommendations for actions to be taken by the Board. The Board of Governors reviews the report and recommendations, discusses the Grievance and makes the final decision regarding resolution of the Grievance. The member is then notified and has forty-five (45) days in which to appeal the decision to the Board. Three Grievances will be presented.

Grievance 05-2024

This Grievance was submitted by the Chairman of the Racquet Sports Committee for alleged confrontational, negative, and combative behavior at the tennis facility and at other clubs during team tennis matches. The Members reported behavior is in violation of Bylaw Article X, Section 10.02 endangering the welfare, safety, harmony and good reputation of the Club and its Members. On investigation it was found that the member's behavioral issues were repeatedly well documented in the members Member File extending back to 2019. At a Pre-Grievance meeting the member was noted to be disruptive, defensive, and combative.

Grievance Committee investigation substantiated and documented behavior described in the Grievance, including testimony from staff and other Members.

The Grievance Committee Unanimous Recommendations to the Board of Governors:

1. One (1) Year Suspension from all Racquet Sports at Boca West, to be followed by one year Probation.
2. Letters of Apology to Matthew Linderman, President, COO, and General Manager; John Joyce, Director of Racquet Sports; and to the Board of Governors.
3. An appropriate letter to be placed in the member's Member File

The Board of Governors voted to amend the suspension to include all Boca West venues and activities for one year, while in residence; and a permanent ban from representing Boca West Country Club on team sports. The Board was in agreement with all other Grievance Committee recommendations.

The member appealed and the terms of the Board ruling were not amended or reduced.

Grievance 07-2024

This Grievance was submitted by the Chairman of the Racquet Sports Committee for alleged inappropriate behavior at several tennis venues including Group Team Tennis, the Member Guest Event, and at other Clubs with Travel League Tennis. The Members reported behavior is in violation of Bylaw Article X, Section 10.02 endangering the welfare, safety, harmony and good reputation of the Club and its Members.

Investigation of the Grievance Committee confirmed and documented the Member's repeatedly disagreeable behavior which had been angry, profane, inconsiderate and insulting to Boca West Members and Members of other Clubs.

The Grievance Committee Recommendations to the Board of Governors:

1. One (1) year suspension from all Racquet sports followed by a one-year probation.
2. A Permanent Ban from all organized team Racquet Sports activities.

3. Letters of Apology to Mathew Linderman, President, COO, and General Manager; to the Racquet Sports Professional Staff; and to the Board of Governors;.

4. An appropriate letter to be placed in the member's Member File.

The Board of Governors agreed with the Grievance Committee Recommendations.

There was no Appeal.

Grievance 09-2024

This Grievance was submitted by the Chairman of the House and Activities Committee against both Members for their alleged behavior, inappropriate comments, suggestions, and gestures toward a staff member at Grand Central. The Members reported behavior is in violation of Club Bylaws, Article X, Section 10.02 endangering the welfare, safety, harmony and good reputation of the Club and its Members.

Grievance Committee investigation revealed two previous documented incidences of similar behavior. The first Grievance was filed shortly after they became Members of Boca West in 2022. This Grievance was filed following inappropriate behavior toward a staff member in the Boca West Spa and was settled outside of the Grievance Committee with the Member's attorney and the Clubs attorney. Resolution of the Grievance included a lifetime ban from the Boca West Spa, one year suspension from all venues and activities in Boca West, and participation in a Sexual Harassment Avoidance Program.

A second incident occurred August 2023 for inappropriate conduct with a staff member. The Member was brought in for a Pre-Grievance meeting with the Committee Chair and Management and settled with a letter of apology.

This incident is the third within a very short period of Boca West Membership.

The Grievance Committee Unanimous Recommendations to the Board of Governors:

1. Two (2) year suspension of both Members from all Boca West venues and activities.
2. Letters of apology are not requested as the Members indicated they are leaving Boca West and their home sale is scheduled to close at the end of September.
3. Appropriate letters will be placed in both members Member Files.

The Board of Governors agreed with the Grievance Committee Recommendations.

There was no Appeal.

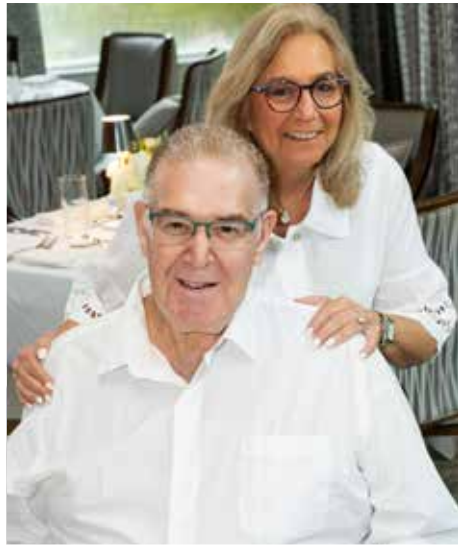

CHAIRMAN'S LETTER

For those who have not yet returned, the interior is exquisite and the outdoor views breathtaking. Blue Point and Aria are not only a feast for the eyes – they offer the finest cuisine from land and sea, nightlife, cocktails, a fabulous lite bites bar menu and vibe. Our beautiful dining room, cardroom, game room, lounge areas and outdoor decks overlook the tranquility of the Aquatics Center and provide the perfect setting for every occasion. The lush and scenic green fairways of Palmer I golf course offer a stunning backdrop complete with beautiful horizon skies.

As expressed in my opening remarks at the Ribbon Cutting, this project has been a labor of love. A project of this magnificence and scope is the result of vision, passion, commitment and strength of continuity from start to finish. We recognize all those who supported this project over the past years – our Members, Past Chairman, Board of Governors, Special Project Committees, Management and Professional teams for their countless hours and dedication.

But most importantly, we recognize that there has been one constant throughout this incredible project, one person who led the way; our very own President, COO and General Manager **Matthew Linderman** - whose vision, focus, commitment, passion, determination and attention to each and every detail is worthy of our highest praise. Having worked alongside Matthew, and witnessed daily his unwavering commitment to our Membership, Board and Staff, it is with respect and appreciation that I applaud and thank you.

As we look forward, I am pleased to update you on several important topics:

Project Updates

At the time of this writing, the estimated total cost of the Project which includes the renovation and construction of the Main Clubhouse, Mr. D's, Fitness Center, Aquatics Complex, Cabana Bar & Grill, Pool House, Multi-Purpose Room, Cabana Shop, Market Square, Lifestyle Center and Art Studio remains the same as reported at our Annual Meeting in February.

In late June, Matthew and I shared that our primary focus was to obtain final TCO which was achieved this past August with the opening of the Lifestyles Center, Blue Point and Aria Bar. In our continued communications and discovery provided by our retained Accounting and Forensic Consultants and review by our retained Counsel, we have empowered our retained Counsel to take all actions necessary to bring the construction project costs in question to a fair and just conclusion. We will continue to keep you informed as this process may extend over a period of months.

This January, we will present to Membership proposed future short-term projects. Please refer to the Special Projects Committee article on pages 20-21 for details of what's to come.

Tax Holiday and Update on Refund:

We have engaged Pricewaterhouse Coopers International (PwC) to assist in filing a Claim for Refund of the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 Sales Tax Holidays. For the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 Sales Tax Holiday years, the Club collected 46% and 42% of the Dues billed for the fiscal years respectively. Documentation supporting the Refund Claim is being prepared at this time and will be filed thereafter. We will inform Members as we receive updates.

Online Payments:

Several upgrades are occurring on our Cobalt technology platform including moving to a new merchant service provider and installation of credit card devices. Online Member payments for monthly statement charges went live in September 2024 and include an option to pay either via ACH with no additional Fee or by Credit Card with a 3% Service Fee pass through. Online payments for future Dues are being programmed and scheduled to be implemented for next year's Dues processing. Members may also choose to continue to pay Monthly Statement charges and Dues by check.

Financial Update for the nine months ended June 30, 2024:

Boca West Country Club remains in an excellent financial position. Please refer to the Finance Report, prepared by Arthur Schwartzman, Finance Chair on page 29 for details.

In closing, I continue to be energized and inspired by the support, momentum and proud history that is Boca West. As we embark on a new Season, be assured that your Board of Governors and Management Team continue to work collaboratively and proactively to serve our Members addressing both immediate and long-term initiatives to benefit our global Boca West community. The Club exhibits a level of excitement, growth and excellence where our Members enjoy the finest amenities, facilities and service that are the envy of Clubs throughout the Country and the World. Boca West is the highest rated residential private Country Club in the United States and in the World.
